

July 27, 2025 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail. — Father John Muir

DID YOU KNOW?

As we continue to "book" Mass intentions for the remainder of this year and into next year at St. Stan's, Our Mother of Sorrows, and St. Hedwig's, did you know???

According to Church Law, known as Canon Law, a parish's pastor is required to celebrate a "*pro populo*" Mass every weekend. *Pro Populo* is a Latin phrase that means "for the people"; that is, for the people of his parish(es). So, when you hear a petition "for the people of St. Whoever" during the General Intercessions, that is the fulfillment of the Canonical requirement of the pastor.

Consequently, if a parishioner requests that a Mass be celebrated for a loved one on a Saturday evening then, by canonical necessity, the Sunday Mass becomes the *pro populo* Mass. Likewise, if a parishioner request a Sunday Mass in memory of a loved one, by canonical necessity, the Saturday evening Mass becomes the *pro populo* Mass.

The faithful are encouraged to have Masses celebrated for loved ones. Typically, a \$10 "Mass stiped" is attached to this Mass. After the priest celebrates this Mass, he receives his "stipend." The *pro populo* Mass, however, does not have a stipend attached to it. It is not celebrated for any specific individual or intention, but is celebrated on behalf of all the people entrusted to his care.

Since the celebration of Mass has infinite value, the benefits of the *pro populo* Mass extends to all of the pastor's parishioners, even if that includes multiple parishes.

The purpose of the *pro populo* Mass is to fulfill the primary and fundamental responsibility of the pastor: the salvation of souls.
